Romans 15:14-16; Colossians 3:16; Galatians 6:1-6

Since we are all ignorant and forgetful at times, we need good instructors to teach



LEADER NOTES: Encourage your members to pull out their notes and review the

Read Romans 15:14-16. Why does Paul believe that the Roman Christians are capable of instructing others?

What qualifies someone to teach others in Christian truth? Is the task of teaching reserved solely for the "professionals" who have studied in seminary, or can anybody do it? What might disqualify a person from this role?

Read Colossians 3:16. How is the act of singing songs, hymns and spiritual songs a means of teaching others? How is it different than delivering a sermon or lecture?

Read Galatians 6:1-6. How are we to instruct fellow Christians who are caught in sin? What should we be careful about while we are doing this?
