1 REVIEW THE SERMON

How would we recognize in ourselves, if we were living as if Friday were the end of the story, denying the resurrection?

What were Friday and Saturday like for those what were following after Jesus? What did Peter do? What will happen to us then, if we begin to live by lies or allow them to take footholds?

How do we avoid deception by basing our lives on God's revelation?

Why are we to be the most 'pitied' if the resurrection did not happen? What are the logical consequences of the fact of Christ's resurrection?

2 ASSESS YOUR LIFE

How are your actions bearing out the truth of what you believe about the power of the resurrection?

What is a lie that has crept into your life that is so close to home for you that you don't (or don't want to) reexamine the truth of it?

When we surround ourselves with those who do not live in the power of the resurrection, how does apathy affect our walk and witness as it becomes normalized?

3 APPLY THE TRUTH

How do we understand inconsistency to be a clear indicator of immaturity in a believer's life?

How does the denial of seemingly smaller truths eventually and logically lead to the undermining and erosion of foundational gospel truth?

How do we avoid deception by living the truth consistently?

How is the Christian life meant to be a testimony through the difficulty and persecution, that only makes sense if Christ is raised? How is your testimony
